Over the past few years, Lane County residents have been faced with the effects of snow and ice storms, as well as fire, smoke, and windstorms. On March 6, 2024, our community came together for an important event focused on emergency preparedness. Prepare-a-Palooza was aimed at equipping attendees with the knowledge, resources, and tools needed to stay safe and ready in times of crisis.

Community partners, first responders and other local resources came together to offer presentations, and interactive demonstrations. We had over 20 booths with local resources offering information on preparing for emergencies. As participants visited the various booths, they were able to gather important information and even some emergency preparedness items.

There were educational workshops covering a range of topics including the importance of preparing GO Bags (Lane County Public Health), personal disaster preparedness (Resource Tap Disaster Support Services), loss of power (EWEB), preparing your pets for an emergency (Greenhill Humane Society), learning how the brain responds in an emergency (Alexis Reed Behavior Consulting), and how you and your providers can prepare for an emergency (Creating Options).

Attendees had the chance to participate in hands-on demonstrations, such as hands-only CPR. These interactive activities helped individuals practice essential emergency procedures in a controlled environment.

Local organizations and emergency response agencies set up booths to provide valuable information and resources to the community. Attendees could learn about emergency kits, disaster planning and preparing for an emergency, pet preparedness, creating evacuation plans, route preparedness, first aid, fire alarm safety, home safety tips, and preparing for an emergency when untraditionally housed. Communication cards and buttons were available, as well as slime and a sensory table. Attendees also had an opportunity to take part in a survey on barriers to emergency preparedness.

Attendees were able to meet with emergency responders, 911 representatives, and other experts in emergency planning. Emergency vehicles were on site.

The fair fostered a sense of community resilience and cooperation, emphasizing the importance of neighbors helping each other during emergencies. Participants were encouraged to build strong networks and support systems to enhance overall preparedness and response capabilities.

With supports like case management from his Personal Agent at Full Access, his counselor at Vocational Rehabilitation, job developer/coach and Attendant Care/Day Support Activities at his provider agency, Eric has a well-rounded team of professionals to ensure he lives the life he wants with the activities he chooses.

Eric is extremely creative and loves making experimental music, creating digital art, writing, reading, and spending time at home with his long-term partner and their cat Malcolm.


Client Spotlight

MPS has worked closely with Matthew and his family to create a good working relationship with The Public House and their employees. The job coaches help to set the tone for Matthew's workday with upbeat, infectious attitudes and professionalism.

Before starting his job at The Public House in 2021, Matthew was a long-time volunteer at Food for Lane County. He boxed lunches for school programs, sorted donations, and cleaned. Matthew's favorite activity, however, was learning food preparation. This allowed him to gain experience with comfortably using a knife and safely handling food. Matthew was well liked, and his contributions were so valued that he earned an award for being an outstanding volunteer.

When Matthew isn't working, he likes to spend time with his family. Since Matthew is not one for relaxing, he keeps busy by helping with chores, playing video games, reading, and going on road trips. He loves nature and spending time outside. He envisions a future with a house with a big yard and lots of trees.
