#### ATTENDANT CARE

Individualized one-on-one support at home and in the community to help adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities learn how to become more independent and engaged.

#### TRANSPORTATION

While providing support services, this allows staff members to transport individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to access resources, gain social experience, and shop for needs and wants.

#### **DSA PROGRAM**

A variety of groups and events held throughout the week to learn new skills, meet new people and explore the community. Some groups will meet at the Allies office while others meet in the community with day supports.

#### ART CONNECTIONS PROGRAM

Explore a wide range of art groups designed to make art accessible to all. From Arts and Crafts, Textile Arts, Book Arts Creation, Community Art Exploration to our Art Professionals groups, we ensure that every artist can fully engage in a variety of art projects designed to spark imagination and creativity.

#### SPEED FRIENDING

Open to the public with support if necessary. Structured, supportive and safe environments, opportunities for socialization and relationship building.
